

The Covid Process:



What happens if a child or staff member shows symptoms of the Coronavirus (COVID-19).



If a child/staff member or someone they live with displays symptoms at home, they must not come to school.



If a child/staff member displays symptoms at school, we will send them home.



They must have a test as soon as possible to see if they have the virus.

They'll have to stay at home until they have their results.



If a child or member of staff has a positive test they need to isolate for 10 days from the onset of symptoms.

They should only return to school if they do not have symptoms other than a cough or loss of smell or taste.



If a child tests negative and if they feel well and no longer have symptoms similar to coronavirus (COVID-19), they can stop self-isolating and return to school.



In the event of a child of a member of staff testing positive for COVID-19 we will work with the Department for Education to undertake an assessment to determine if any contacts in the setting need to self-isolate at home for 14 days.

As per government advise, the contacts' wider household will NOT need to isolate.



The relevant school spaces will be deep cleaned to reduce the risk or further spread of infection. Those advised to stay at home will be issued a return date and should not return before then.

Student/staff should follow the home learning guidance where able to do so.
